

Shared Measurement System Goals & Baseline Data

The shared measurement system framework, shown in the triangle graphic to the right, was developed by network members and partners to clarify shared goals, create accountability for change, align action around shared priorities for greater impact, and guide strategy design. Development and further refinement of the goals, metrics and leading indicators is still in process.

The tables below provide baseline data for shared measurement system goals that have been defined to date. A cross-sector workgroup of network partners is in the process of finalizing some of the goal metrics based on sources of available data.

Over time, this will be updated to include a dashboard that demonstrates progress over time specific to each defined goal.
